Women should know this facts:

- All women should have regular visits with a health care provider
- Cervical cancer is cause by a common virus called HPV. Anyone who ever had sex can get HPV.
- The best prevention for cervical cancer is the cervical cancer screening, HPV vaccination, abstinence, safe sexual practice.
- Most cervical cancer can be treated and cure if detected early.
- If you get an abnormal test result, be sure to follow up as told by your doctor.

What else we can do to prevent Cervical Cancer

- Keep and attend your next appointment with your doctor
- Go back for more testing or treatment if your doctor tells you to.
- Encourage family members and friends to go for cervical screening program.

Cervical Cancer often does not cause symptoms until it is advanced. So it is important to get screened even when you feel healthy.

Some risk factors

- Sexual activities at young age
- Multiple sex partner
- Unprotected sex
- Unhealthy Lifestyle
- Smoking






What is Cervical Cancer?

Cervical Cancer is a **Preventable cancer of the Cervix**. Cervical Cancer can grow on your cervix- the same way other cancer can grow on other body parts. It does not cause symptoms until advanced. Women with advanced cervical cancer may have abnormal bleeding, discharge, or pain.

It can take 10 to 15 years (or more) for **abnormal cells** to turn into cancer

What is the Cervix?



Cervix is the opening of your uterus (womb). It is part of a woman's reproductive system.

Functions of the cervix include:


- Producing some of the moistness that lubricate the vagina.
- Produce the mucus that facilitates survival and travel of sperms up to the fallopian tube to fertilize the egg.
- Holding the developing baby in the uterus during pregnancy.

What causes Cervical Cancer?

A virus, called human papillomavirus also just called HPV— can cause normal cells on your cervix to turn abnormal. Over many years, abnormal cells can turn into cancer if they are not found and treated by your doctor.

What is HPV?

HPV is a virus that is commonly transmitted through sexual intercourse and other sexual activities. It can infect the genital areas of both men and women. Early infection may usually has no signs and symptoms and go away on its own.



Abnormal cells are sometimes called "precancer cells" because they are not normal, but they have not yet cause cancer.

Diagnose

- Pap Smear- available In Samoa
- Cervical Biopsy
- HPV DNA screening programs for cervical cancer.

How can I Prevent Cervical Cancer.

You can prevent cervical cancer with regular screening test, like Pap test and the HPV DNA test. All women should start getting regular screening test soon after their first engagement in sexual activities.

Pap Smear Test

Pap smear is the screening test for cervical cancer. It looks for abnormal cells on your cervix that could turn into cancer over time.

HPV Test/ Vaccine

- Vaccination with HPV vaccine is a very effective way of preventing cervical Cancer
- Young adolescent females (10-24 years) must be vaccinated before they are ever engage in sexual activities.
